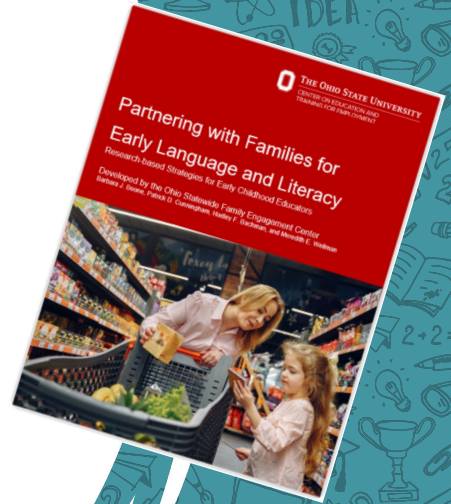

Overview of professional development toolkit

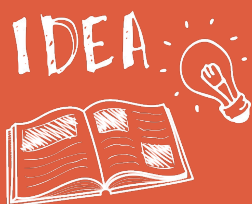
- One-hour professional development for schools and districts to use with their staff
