through computers, she had really taken the time
to get to know each of her students and assess their needs in a way
that would be similar to them being in the classroom.

I just feel like through this whole experience, I was able to communicate
well with our teachers and they were able to communicate with us,
which has made this process seem so much smoother.

And I think it's what's made our children so successful during this challenging time.
