





#### Redesign for Family Engagement

Family engagement is not one-size-fits-all. Rather, with more choices, supports and flexibility, more families will be able to support their school-age child's learning at home.

- Highlight the relevance for families. How will this be enjoyable? Interesting? Important for the child or family?
- Present information and opportunities to families in different ways that address challenges.
- Provide multiple ways that families can choose to be engaged in a way that fits their family.
